Handwashing Competency

Question	True	False

Utilizing a Lift for Transfers

seams prior to each use.		
Each lift has an emergency off and release button

A total lift requires a 2 person assist for safety purposes		

Gait Belt Transfers

Utilization of a gait belt does not take the place of using safe		
patient handling equipment		
Gait belt should be snug but comfortable, you should be able to		
place your hand between the patient and the belt		
Gait belts have a 600lb weight limit		

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Personal Protective Equipment

Question	True	False
When applying PPE the gown is the first piece to be donned		
When removing gown, pull the gown away from neck and shoulders touching the inside of the gown inside out, roll into bundle and discard		
N95 mask requires FIT testing to be completed annually		

Indwelling Urinary (foley) Catheter Care

Question	True	False
Urinary drainage system works best when the bag is below the bladder		
Routine hygiene with soap and water to the periurethral area is recommended		
Bladder irrigation is not recommended unless ordered by physician		
Specimens collected from an indwelling urinary catheter must be noted on a laboratory requestion or in the urine culture order		

Insertion of urinary catheter (foley)

Question	True	False
Insert the catheter through the meatus 2-3 inches or until urine		
flows freely		
Inflate the balloon to capacity with sterile water and allow to fall		
back		

Blood Glucose Monitoring

Question	True	False
Use alcohol wipes to cleanse the patients' fingertips and allows		
too thoroughly		
Discard lancet and meter strip in sharps container		
Clean meter with bleach wipe and allow for appropriate dry time		
before use		

Tracheostomy Care

Question	True	False
Rotate the lock on the inner cannula and turn the inner cannula in counterclockwise and remove and place in hydrogen peroxide solution		
Utilize sterile gloves, cleanse inner cannula suction outer cannula and replace inner cannula		

Compression Stocking Application

Question	True	False
During application, foot is held in a dorsiflex position (90%)		
Spiral wrap with minimal overlaps up to 2 finger widths below		
the popliteal crease		

Injections

Questions	True	False
To complete a TB skin, test the needle is inserted with bevel		
up at a 5-15 degree angle and inserting solution to create 6-		
10mm wheal		
A subcutaneous injection is inserted on a 45–90-degree angle		
Insulin is given via a subcutaneous injection		
Intramuscular injections are mostly, administered in the deltoid		
muscle, upper lateral thigh, lateral upper quadrant, major		
gluteal muscle		
When giving an Intramuscular injection, lidocaine is usually		
mixed with antibiotic to reduce pain associated with injection		

Wound Care

Questions	True	False
Cleanse the wound from center outward		
Dressing should extend at least 1 inch over the edges of the wound		
Wound care is to be completed using a clean technique		
Wounds require weekly measurements		

Staging of wounds

Question	True	False
Red non blanchable with intact skin is a stage 1 pressure area		
Document areas according to wound size, base, edges, drainage,		
edema, and pain with signs/symptoms of infection		
Moisture Associated skin damage (MASD) is caused by		
excessive moisture against the skin.		
A deep tissue injury is an injury to the patients underlying tissue		
below the skin's surface that results from prolonged pressure in		
an area of the body. A DTI is not able to be staged		
Eschar is a black, dry and leathery and may form a thick covering		
similar to a scab over the wound bed below.		

Central Line Dressing Change

Question	True	False
Central line dressing utilizes a sterile transparent occlusive		
dressing		
Central line dressing is completed with a sterile procedure		
If gauze is present under central line dressing, then the dressing		
must be changed in 24 hours
